This Lake Central Airlines DC-3 is N41831, c/n 3275 is seen here at O'Hare Airport in Chicago in December 1959. This was originally a DC-3A for Swiftlite in Feb. 1941 as NC1000. On Sept. 6, 1941 it was reregistered as NC41831 and two weeks later on Sept. 24, it was impressed into the USAAF as 42-6505 becoming a C-53D. On March 14, 1942 it was registered as a C-48C and given another serial number, 42-38260 but this number was never taken up. It went to Europe to serve with the RAF then to Africa with the ATC. It was back in Europe in 1945 and returned to the States in June 1945 serving then with mid-continent Airlines. It went through Braniff Air Lines, Lake Central and a number of charter companies. In 1979 while flying for Zamrud as PK-WWL it was withdrawn from service.
